Have you visited the "Trailhead" recently? F.O.S.S. constructed a twelve panel kiosk, and once the fire hazard lessens we will be completing the site work and installing the information panels on:

- Erosion and Noxious Weeds
- Friends of the South Slopes
- Trail Etiquette
- Special Features in the Park

- "Donations" Panel

Three BC Parks' panels are already erected:

- A map of Myra-Bellevue Park
- Protected Areas Message
- Other Okanagan Provincial Parks

A Regional District Parks' information sign will soon be installed.

Major funding for the kiosk project was through a grant from the


Joe Rich/McCulloch Lake area: As a long-time director of F.O.S.S., Reg Volk ably represents the interests of his community. Reg works closely with Gorman Bros. Lumber, Riverside Forest Products and Weyerhaeuser to monitor logging on the South Slopes and its potential



impact on existing recreation trails. By cultivating a positive relationship with these logging companies, Reg continues to work with other dedicated volunteers to ensure the preservation of the Okanagan Highlands Trail and other trails in the McCulloch Lake/Joe Rich area. In many cases, trails need to be re-routed because of logging, but through the collaborative approach of Reg's committee, this is often a success story. On behalf of FOSS, Reg is carrying on the fine work started by Mike Whitaker and all the volunteers who built the Okanagan Highlands Trail. Mike continues to be actively involved as a volunteer in his tireless efforts to develop this trail.

Help!!!

There is a large area of public land lying west of Bellevue Creek, including the Gillard Creek Forest Service Road, Chute Lake area, and Okanagan Mountain Provincial Park. Currently, we do not have a director on our board representing the area. This is an intensely used recreational area and this will only increase as new subdivisions are developed in the South Mission. F.O.S.S. Directors are looking ahead to 2004, and we encourage someone to come forward to run for the board of directors at the AGM in November to represent the Mission. This person will be interested in responsible, low impact recreation on the South Slopes, willing to attend one directors' meeting each month (2nd Thursday) and to chair a committee reporting on the crown lands west of Bellevue Creek, and be committed to working collaboratively with other directors to represent a variety of recreational groups and interests.
