MYRA BELLEVUE AND OK MOUNTAIN PROVINCIAL PARKS REMAIN **CLOSED TO THE GENERAL PUBLIC**

It's been a very busy time for F.O.S.S. since the Okanagan Mountain Provincial Park forest fire.

With BC Parks' permission, FOSS volunteers have gone into Myra Bellevue and Okanagan Mountain Parks to survey the damage. Both parks are severely damaged by the fire and many of the trails have downed or burned trees across them, many bridges are burned and the ground under the snow in both of these parks is a deep layer of ash. In Myra Bellevue there are GREEN areas in the Little White Mtn. section and the eastern areas of the park. Surveying is continuing in OK Mountain park to see how extensive the damage is. Some F.O.S.S. members, notably Eric Rayson and Fred Gubbels, started to remove some of the large trees across the trails in both parks. This work will continue (weather permitting).

Two of our directors have left the board and I would like to thank Bill Redston and Cathy Richards for their work over the last few years. I would like to welcome Sharon Adams on to the board. Sharon grew up in the OK Mountain Park area and will provide expertise on that park.

Fundraising for opening up the two parks has taken up quite a bit of time for F.O.S.S. The Central Okanagan Foundation Fire Relief fund the Provincial Gaming Commission and Montana's Restaurant have all provided funds for this cause. As well, F.O.S.S. still has funds from Interior Savings which will be applied to the Angel Spring area.

BC Parks must make the decision when to open up the parks. F.O.S.S. is working with BC Parks to achieve this goal.

Volunteer Agreement Signed

In November, F.O.S.S. signed a 'volunteer agreement' with BC Parks giving us permission to work in the two Provincial Parks while they remain closed to the public. This volunteer agreement authorizes F.O.S.S. to:

- * assess damage to trails, bridges and facilities and apply for reconstruction grants
- * develop lower elevation trails in Myra-Bellevue, along the urban interface on the northern perimeter of the park and re-build/decommission trails as needed

Volunteers have been at work throughout the winter. To date, Lost Lake Single Track (in Myra-Bellevue) and 1/2 of the Boulder Trail and sections of the Wild Horse Canyon Trail and the C.N. Trail (In Okanagan Mountain) have been cleared.

VOLUNTEERS WILL BE F.O.S.S. CLEARLY VISIBLE IN THE PARKS. THEY WILL BE WEARING SAFETY VESTS, SAFETY HATS AND "AUTHORIZED VOLUNTEER" IDENTIFICATION.

\$22,000 Grant Through the Central Okanagan Foundation

In mid-January, F.O.S.S. received a grant of \$22,000.00 from the *Fire Relief Fund administered by the Central Okanagan Foundation*. This cheque was presented to F.O.S.S. President, Peter Thompson (above right) by COF director Tom Fellhauer (left) during a site visit to Lost Lake in Myra-Bellevue Park where F.O.S.S. volunteers have been clearing trails. COF Executive Director Janice Henry and Grant Coordinator Sandi Oloffs joined F.O.S.S. directors Penny Gubbels and Peter Thompson to see firsthand one of the areas where the grant will be used - to rebuild two bridges over Priest Creek that were destroyed by last summer's wildfire.

The Central Okanagan Foundation is F.O.S.S.'s largest benefactor, with previous grants in 2000 and 2002. The COF was the major contributor to the construction of the Stewart Rd. East Trailhead.

The grant from the Fire Relief Fund will be used to rebuild bridges and culverts destroyed by the fire and to purchase new trail signs, provide safety equipment and training for volunteers, and for other construction materials.

What's Ahead for F.O.S.S. in 2004?

- In Myra-Bellevue and Okanagan Mountain Provincial Parks...

- Volunteers will continue to clear trails so that when BC Parks re-opens the parks, cyclists, hikers, runners and equestrians will stay on the existing trails
- Once the snow is gone, volunteers will further assess trail and facility damage and make plans for reconstruction.
- FOSS will undertake projects to restore habitat and recreational opportunities on the South Slopes
- Signs will be purchased to educate the public about which trails are open and which trails are closed for rehabilitation

- In Myra-Bellevue...

- Improve trails and signage in the areas of the park that were not damaged by the fire but may have been impacted by fire suppression activities. These trails are along the interface with the city, and also east and west of Little White Forest Service Road
- Bring the trails up to BC Parks' standards
- When the park re-opens, encourage visitors to use "green" areas of the park so that areas burned by the fire will have a better opportunity to recover
- Repair fencing at the Trailhead and provide new fencing at the Harvard Rd. entrance to the park

- Promote the public's use of the extensive trail system on the crown land south-east of Myra-Bellevue Park (the Joe Rich, McCulloch Lake areas of the South Slopes)

- Complete projects delayed by the fire:

- Develop the Angel Springs Interpretive Trail. This project will be expanded to include the repositioning of the trail. The original trail was widened and used as a fire guard and was lost when this fire break was decommissioned.
- Parking Lot at the Stewart Rd. East Trailhead ...improve the surface of the parking lot - gravel and grade ...complete the kiosk - install the information panels and landscape with native species
 - ...install a bike rack and picnic tables at the Trailhead ...provide ongoing maintenance of Trailhead facilities: security, cleaning and pumping out the pit toilets

- And Beyond 2004

Directors are brainstorming ideas for the future. Some of the ideas under discussion are:

- establishing an endowment fund (See article in this newsletter) * re-planting a corridor of native trees in burned out areas along the major
- trails in the two provincial parks (subject to BC Parks approval) *
- undertaking a public education project about the Okanagan Mtn. Provincial Park forest fire *
- building a trail along KLO Creek connecting the Mission Creek Greenway (Phase 2) with Angel Springs and the KVR
