SUNFLOWER FESTIVAL -A DAY WITH NATURALISTS

The Central Okanagan Naturalists' Club is hosting its first Sunflower Festival in celebration of its 50th anniversary since incorporation by honoring the flowering of the Arrow-leaved Balsamroot (Balsamorhiza sagittata) commonly called the Okanagan Sunflower.

The Okanagan Sunflower Festival will take place on Saturday, April 30, 2011 from 6:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. The one day event features an official opening ceremony by Mayor Sharon Shepherd at 8:00 a.m. and a pancake breakfast 8:00 to 10:00 a.m. located at Mission Creek Regional Park gazebo. The aim of the springtime celebration of the Okanagan Sunflower is to promote the best family festival in our valley both for our communities and for visitors alike.

Registration and the purchase of tickets to most of the following events are required.

- Scenic Canyon hike showcasing the geology of Layer Cake Mountain with geologist Dr. Robert Young and botanist, Dr. George Scotter as they walk through fields of flowering Arrow-leaved Balsam root and other wildflowers, 9:00 a.m. to 1:30 p.m.
- **Knox Mountain geology walk** with Dr Murray Roed and CONC botanists leading a slower nature walk 10:00 to 11:30 a.m. and 1:30 to 3:00 p.m.
- Kalamoir Park fun filled walks with Naturalist, Scott Alexander, hiking through the profusion of Arrow-leaved Balsamroot. Two hikes 10:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.12:00 to 3:30 p.m.
- **Geocaching for Children** a GPS based treasure hunt led by **Chris Byrd, teacher** at the EECO Centre 1:30 to 2:30 p.m.
- **Children's Nature Games** for children ages 5 to 10 joining CONC Young Naturalists in interpreting nature through games. 2:30 3:30 p.m.
- First Nations cuisine and Native Plants presentation, Leonard Raphael of the Merritt First Nation describes the traditional use of native plants for food and medicine as **Kekuli Restaurant**, **West Kelowna** serves an array of traditional foods. 4:30 to 6:00 p.m.
- Bats of Peachland, biologist and bat expert, Tanya Luszcz explains the behavior and identity of the bats that live in Peachland including a view of the largest bat colony in British Columbia in the Old Peachland Primary School. Meet at Peachland Little Schoolhouse 7:00 to 9:00 p.m.
