

On February 4, 2015 FOSS was presented with the 2014 BC Parks *Volunteer Group of the Year* award at an awards banquet held in Victoria.


Preparing to hike the Pacific Crest Trail

The Pacific Crest Trail (PCT) is a long distance hiking trail that runs from Mexico to Canada through California, Oregon and Washington. It is a total of 4,265 km. In past years we have run, hiked and backpacked several sections of the PCT. This year my husband George and I have decided to attempt a thru-hike. We will hike northbound starting in Campo, California and ending at Monument 78 near Manning Park, Canada. Preparation and planning for our hike started in September 2014. We purchased several guidebooks and maps and have been studying them. We also ordered and picked up our custom made backpacks. We have compiled a list of gear and clothing we think we will need. This list changes regularly as we re-think and weigh various items in an attempt to lighten our loads. We hope to carry less than 13kg each, including food and water. Our requirements will change as we travel north from the deserts of California to the snowy passes in the Sierra and Cascade mountains. Re-supplying along the route will be accomplished in two ways: buying food as we go and mailing pre-packaged meals from home. I have dehydrated and vacuum sealed 60 meals. These meals along with other items of gear and clothing will be mailed as resupply boxes. Together George and I have reviewed the guidebooks and picked out the locations of our re-supply. These boxes must be prepared before we leave. They will be labelled and include instructions for my sister in Kelowna as to when and where to mail them. We also must have our home affairs in order before we go. This includes setting up automatic payments for our regular monthly bills. We have applied for the necessary permits and have contacted Border Services for re-entry into Canada via the PCT. Physical and mental preparation is also a factor. Daily hikes are a part of our weekly routine. We plan on hiking an average of 30 km

a day. Our starting date will be April 22, 2015. If all goes as planned we will arrive at the Canadian border by late September. Thru-hiking the PCT has been on our bucket list for many years. We both turned 65 last year and we decided this year was our year to do it. Happy Trails !

FOSS' Myra-Bellevue/Okanagan Mountain Provincial Park Legacy Fund

Following the 2003 Okanagan Mountain Provincial Park forest fire, FOSS was the recipient of some major funding initiatives to help restore the trails in areas that burned or were impacted by the fire.

FOSS' primary initiative was a partnership with Katim Enterprises who secured a Human Resource Development Canada grant for a Job Creation Partnership. Katim hired ten people and the project spanned a nine month period.

The project, "Reclamation of Fire Affected Recreation Areas", was highly successful. The Katim

crew re-opened trails, built bridges, installed culverts, gates and bollards, did major erosion mitigation and restoration work, built water bars, re-routed trails that utilized had been as fire-quards. decommissioned some trails, did hazard tree mitigation, installed the majority of the sign posts and trail signs and undertook many other park improvement projects.

FOSS volunteers contributed hundreds of hours working with the Katim crew and raising funds for materials such as lumber, signs, posts. Public support was incredible-major donors included the Kelowna & Area Fire Recovery Fund, Okanagan Central Foundation and Interior Savings Credit Union.

In 2006, FOSS established a \$15,000

perpetual endowment with the Central Okanagan Foundation (COF). The Myra-Bellevue/Okanagan Mtn. Provincial Park Legacy Fund provides an annual "gift" to FOSS based on how well the COF's investments have done in the year. FOSS's annual benefit from this fund has ranged from zero in 2008/2009 (bad years for anyone with investments!) to \$1,582 in 2014. The 2014 funds will be applied to a major trail improvement project FOSS is planning for 2015 --- details will be announced very soon.
