There are four (4) BC Society Act Bylaw Amendments proposed by the Directors of Friends of South Slopes (FOSS). These were supported at the January 28, 2025 Board Meeting.

These Bylaw changes refer to Quorum, Directors, Classes of Membership and notification of members about an AGM

Change Part 5 Item 27 (2) leaving 27 (1) as is. 2) A director so appointed, holds office until the next annual general meeting of the society and is then eligible to be appointed for three (3) years with up to two (2) additional terms for a maximum of nine (9) years.
